
It is most difficult to attempt to think back and make sense of the copies of the letters that you sent and the copy of the letter enclosed. I faintly recall one of the letters that you sent - the one that I had signed. It is now obvious that black and white film was exposed during the post mortem.

As the film holders were exposed, they were taken by one of the Special Agents in attendance at the post mortem. In my opinion, the copy of the letter enclosed is an accurate version of the film involved.

In regards to the copies of the letters that you enclosed. As I said above, I do faintly remember the one letter that I had signed. I do not recall the facts concerning the corrections, numbers or circumstances surrounding same.

I have not been able to locate a copy of the letter that Dr. Stover required the participants at the post mortem to sign.

Reference is made to your memorandum dated 22 November, 1963, to Roy H. Kellerman, Assistant Special Agent in Charge, U. S. Secret Service, relative to the following:

(a) 11 graphic film holders (4 x 5) containing 16 sheets of exposed Ektachrome E3 film (holders actually contained 21 sheets of film) one holder loaded one side only.

(b) 9 graphic film holders (4 x 5) containing 12 sheets exposed Portrait Pan film (Holders contained 18 sheets of exposed film)
