Dear Mr. Bunkin:

I have your letter of woril 30, in which you recuested further information relative to a false story deliberately planted by an agent of the Secret Service and to the details of my oncounter with two Special Aments of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. I am gratified that you are interacted in a false statement deliberately planted by an agent of the Secret Service, inasmuch as we have been led to believe that the Commission is relying upon the accuracy of the statements made by investigatory arencies including the Secret Service. Under such circumstances, it seems to me that a thorough investigation of the false statement made by the arent of the Secret Service is rooulded.

I am not clear as to whether you would like me to appear before the Commission and present such information while I am under oath. If that is your prefer toe, I will be happy to fly to Mashington to testify before the Commission. If you orefer, instead, morely a statement in a latter from me detailing the incidents referred to above, I shall be happy to comply with that request.

I am continuing in my efforts to secure permission to release to you the name of the person who gave me information regarding the meeting which took place grior to the assassination and which was attended by Officer Tippit, Barnard Melssman, and a third person whose name I have to the Consission while in executive session.

I am, of course, surprised to hear that Mrs. Markham denies that the gave to me the information which I have indicated publicly that she gave to me and am surprised even more to discover that she denies ever having had a conversation with me. Unless there is some gross error

involved on either Mrs. Markham's part or on mine, one of us seems to make committed penjury. Porhaps under the circumstances it would be manufact, therefore, to refer this matter to the appropriate federal actionities in order that criminal action might be instituted against the person who may be guilty of making false statements under oath.
