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Dear Mr. Blunt:

This is in reply to your letter of February 4, 2005, regarding documents in the John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection.

Specifically, your letter raised two issues. First, you raised the issue of items asked for and not received from the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSCI) from the files of the Church Committee. You mentioned Gerry Hemming's testimony from 5/23/75, which you had not been able to find in spite of the National Archives' statement to the Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB) that the document was indeed in the JFK Collection. You also included a handwritten list dated 5/26/98 from the working files of Ron Haron of items not received from the SSCI. You state, "There is a responsibility on NARA to ensure agencies comply with the ongoing provisions of the ARCA legislation," and question this agency's compliance with those provisions. The second issue you raise (an issue raised in a previous letter dated February 3, 2005), concerns the availability of a finding aid to the recent released of material from the Central Intelligence Agency.

With regards to the Hemming testimony, I am enclosing a copy of a two page document dated 5/23/75 entitled "Re: Interview with Jerry Henning." As this was the name given by Hemming to the Church Committee staff members conducting the interview, this was the name by which the document was indexed in the JFK database. For this reason, searches on the name "Hemming" would not have found this document.

With regards to the documents listed in the 5/26/98 Haron document, I have conducted extensive research into this matter. This included looking through ARRB files—including Ron Haron's—concerning the Church Committee and the Board's dealings with the SSCI. A search of Haron's files found the original of the list you sent, along with a later memorandum dated August 3, 1998, discussing the same issue. As the later document included more information that the handwritten list, but did not contain some documents located between May and August, 1998, I used the August 3 memorandum as the master list of "missing" Church Committee documents.

Based upon Haron's memorandum, a careful reading of the relevant Committee reports, and Church Committee documents, I believe that I can explain most of the "missing" documents. Haron's memorandum listed 62 dates for testimony cited in either the Foreign Assassinations Report, or the JFK Assassination Report. Of these, I was able to locate testimony for 9 of the dates. Of the remaining 53 dates, close study of the relevant reports and comparison with known Church

Committee documents revealed that 8 were typographical errors in the report and refer to extant testimony; 4 dates could not be found at all in the collection; and 8 were for testimony in open hearings published by the Church Committee but not submitted to the ARRB. This leaves 33 dates in the Haron memorandum unaccounted for. Of these, 12 were citations from the JFK Assassination report; 15 were citations to the Foreign Assassination Report; and 6 were unattributed to any particular source.

In attempting to account for the 33 missing documents, I would refer you to the discussion of the compliance of the SSCI with the JFK Act on page 164 of the Board's Final Report. To summarize, the Review Board went back to the Intelligence Committee repeatedly, asking them for explanations concerning missing testimony and other records cited in the Kennedy assassination report of the Church Committee. Each time the Committee cooperated with the Review Board and produced more information. Of particular concern was the fact that, while microfilmed copies of transcripts were identified and produced to the Board, the *original hardcopy* transcripts and accompanying materials related to the Committee's JFK investigation had not been accounted for. The Board requested, and got, permission from the SSCI to have Board staff review the original Church Committee files. This search failed to produce the hardcopy of testimony cited in the JFK report. In their final report, the Review Board stated, "At the time of this Report, the SSCI could not explain the absence of these original transcripts (and perhaps accompanying materials) relating to the Kennedy Assassination."

Based upon the above analysis of the Haron memorandum and the Review Board's own statements in the Final Report, we believe that the National Archives and Records Administration can do nothing further to locate these 33 missing documents.

As for the finding aid to the new CIA releases, the RIF numbers cannot be printed out. We will be glad to supply you with the 4000 page finding aid in our research room on your next visit.

I hope you have found this information useful.
